Andrea Canepa (Lima - 1980) studied Art at the Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú and at the Universidad Politécnica de Valencia (Spain) where she also graduated with a Masters in Visual Arts and Multimedia. In 2014 she was awarded the Young Artist's Prize at ARCO Madrid and in 2013 with the Generaciones Award given by Fundación Montemadrid and the Endesa Grant given by Fundación Endesa in Spain. She has been an artist in residency at Gasworks- London, MATADERO – Madrid, Cité des Arts – Paris, Tokyo Wonder Site –Tokyo, Beta Local, Puerto Rico and Bauhaus – Germany.
